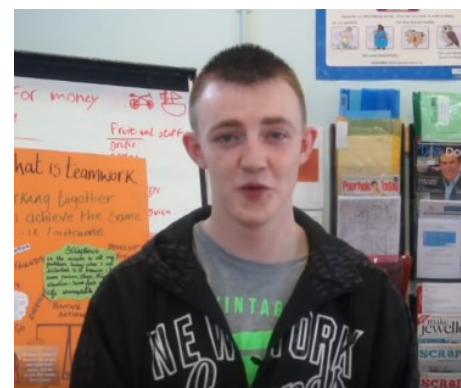

Ballyshannon Fundraise for Irish Guide Dogs



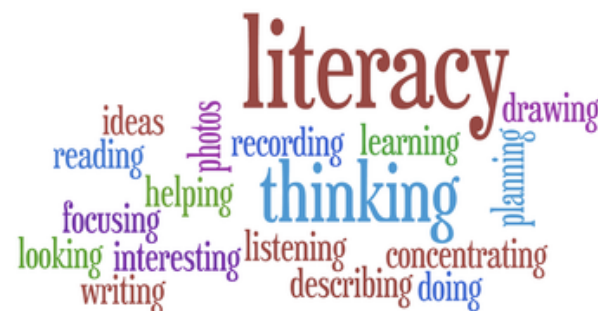
